REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- Copy of passport (non-EU and EU students) or national identity card (EU students only) valid during your entire stay
- Proof of your academic level by sending us your Transcript of Records in English
- Professors at the UAntwerp require their students to have a sufficient knowledge of English to participate in their classes. Proof of your English level (B2 CEFR) through certificate by language center at home institution (Erasmus only) or TOEFL score (minimum of 80) or IELTS score (minimum of 6.5) or Cambridge First Certificate. If English is your mother tongue please provide us with a statement from your home institution. More information about language requirements can be found on our website.
